### **State Masters Games Winners**

Over 400 people from across the state of Alabama attended this year's State Masters Games in Trussville, AL this past October. Of those, 110 were from our area. We had competitors in each of the 30 events winning a total of 92 Gold, 51 Silver, 42 Bronze, and 43 1-Mile Fun Walk Medals. Medals were not the only honors we earned.

#### Check out some of our highlights at the games:

- **5K Run:** Top 3 Overall & won over half of the medals
- **Basketball Free Throw:** Top 5 Women's Scores
- **Softball Throw:** Best Overall Distance
- **Pickleball:** Won over half of the medals
- Won almost half of the medals in Table Tennis. Women's Basketball Free Throw, and Women's Softball Throw.
